THIRD ANNUAL FALL HARVEST FESTIVAL CELEBRATES HARNESS RACING AND AGRICULTURE AT EMPIRE CITY CASINO AT YONKERS RACEWAY ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 22, FROM 5:30 TO 9:30 PM

Fun activities and entertainment for the entire family including pony rides, pumpkin painting, musical entertainment

New York— The leaves begin to change color, a sure sign that Autumn is in the air, and that the Fall Harvest Festival is back for its third year at Empire City Casino at Yonkers Raceway on Saturday, October 22. The one-day celebration of New York State harness racing, agriculture and produce for fans of all ages is on the schedule from 5:30 to 9:30 pm on the track apron. Admission is free.

There will be activities for the young and those young at heart: harness races, pony rides, a petting zoo, pumpkin painting, and musical entertainment. There will also be New York State apple, cheese and wine product sampling, and the Legislators Exhibition Race featuring members of the Assembly and Senate, all making for a special evening. Two large tents will house the musical entertainment, as well as a wide variety of food and beverages for the entire family. There will be a free pinecone scented candle giveaway, for Empire Club members, as well as \$50 betting vouchers and pastoral photos courtesy of Blue Chip Farms.

Dykeman Farms will donate the pumpkins for pumpkins painting fun. **Kimberly's Confections** will be selling their delicious frosted cupcakes a sweet addition to the Harvest Festival. **White Oak Farms**, a member of the New York Maple Association, will have its sugary syrup on display and available for purchase. New York's **Warwick Valley Winery & Distillery** is scheduled to provide wine tastings throughout the evening. A **Sulky Exhibit** and a life-size horse cut out will both allow racing fans the chance for unique picture-taking, and the **Harness Racing Museum Exhibit** will be another treat for fans of the sulky sport.

The New York Sire Stakes races at all of the pari-mutuel harness tracks in New York State (Yonkers, Monticello, Saratoga, Tioga, Vernon, Batavia, and Buffalo) and holds non-pari-mutuel races at 22 County Fairs and the Goshen Historic Track.

The Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund (the Fund) is a public benefit corporation established in 1965 by the Laverne Law (Laws of New York, Chapter 567 of the Laws of 1965). The mission of the Fund is to promote the breeding of standardbred horses and the conduct of equine research within the State. To carry out its legislative mission, the Fund administers the New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) Harness Racing Program. Today the NYSS offers approximately \$16 million in purses and \$1 million in Breeders' Awards, holding races at all of New York State's harness tracks and 22 county fairs, providing unmatched racing and money-earning opportunities for the many horsemen in the Empire State. Additionally, the Fund provides monetary assistance to equine related organizations, including county agriculture societies, the statewide 4-H program and the Harry M. Zweig Fund for Equine Research.
